Employer-owned or employer-arranged housing description:

All students must complete the online employee housing request form. Employee housing rooms are either double or triple occupancy and have an attached bathroom. Rooms come with tv, wifi, mini fridge and microwave. Students may use hot plates or a crock pot in their room. Students must provide their own pillow, twin size sheets, blankets and all toiletries for their room. Housing cost is a \$300.00 deposit (\$250 is refundable) and \$10.00/day. Deposit may be paid on arrival or payroll deducted. Daily rent is always payroll deducted. ARRIVAL INFORMATION

Arrival Instructions:

Students should fly into Bozeman, MT (BZN) and arrange transportation to Big Sky Resort Mountain Village the next day or when the Human Resources office is open. Big Sky Resort does not arrange pickup from the airport.

Students should arrive at Big Sky Resort during HR office hours of Monday - Friday, 9 am and 5 pm to check into their employee housing room.

To arrive during office hours it is suggested that students stay at least one night in Bozeman, MT at a hotel close to Wal Mart on North 7th Ave and take the Skyline Bus (<https://skylinebus.com>) from Wal Mart to Big Sky Mountain Village the next day. Students should pick up any items needed at Wal Mart before traveling to Big Sky. Shopping is limited and more expensive in Big Sky.

Students should book airport pickup from the hotel they will be staying at in Bozeman.

Other options include booking a taxi from the airport to Big Sky Resort from Karst Stage (www.karststage.com) or using Uber.
